The aim of the proposals is to change the way in which the transport network operates and reduce the impact of vehicles on the places where people want to move around, work, visit and enjoy leisure time.

Proposals include:

- enhancement/creation of public spaces;
- redesign of junctions;
- traffic management, with changes to vehicle routing and changes to the types of vehicle allowed in some areas;
- reallocation of road space to active/sustainable travel, such as cycling and walking;
- better integration of modes of transport;
- amendments to parking provision.

The proposals are at an early stage and your feedback will help to shape the next stage of the project plans.
