The aim of the proposals is to change the way in which the transport network operates and reduce the impact of vehicles on the places where people want to move around, work, visit and enjoy leisure time.

In Sherburn-in-Elmet the study aims to address the following additional issues:

- Vehicle dominated environment;
- Limited crossing points for pedestrians and cyclists;
- Informal parking of vehicles;
- Narrow pavements;
- Limited greenery.

The proposals are at an early stage and your feedback will help to shape the next stage of the project plans.
